The County Finals in a couple of weeks will be a tough test but we won't be going there just to make up the numbers.

Early this week, Mrs Winfield, our fabulous teaching assistant and librarian, and I met with sales reps from book companies to purchase books for the children. It is really important that we keep replenishing our supply of children's books as every child at Ickford loves to read. We have also purchased more 'Big Boy' bean bags for the corridors which the children love to snuggle up with their friends in to read during break times. Mind you, I nearly got killed in the rush when I told the ladies in the office what I had put in the corridor and neglected to say they were bean bags!

Next week is Science week with, I believe, a focus on the theme of food. Mrs Honey is responsible for organising the week and, if the past is anything to go by, I am sure every child is going to gain a great deal from next week's lessons and the workshops that have been arranged. Mrs Honey works very hard in organising this and I know that this year has not been easy for her as she has had to make some last minute changes to the timetable but nevertheless, she assures me that everything is now 'good to go'.
