Collecting from School

In the interests of safety, I have asked teachers not to let children go until they have seen the person listed as collecting rather than simply being told by a child that they can, "see my mum/nan/dad etc". Please can you ensure you at least make eye contact with the class teacher at pick up times and that the office is clear about who is collecting or whether the child attends a club or takes the school bus.

Badminton Rackets

We have asked children who bring in their own Badminton rackets to use in Breakfast club or during breaks and PE, to leave them in the sports hall instead of having them in bags in the classroom as they tend to stick out and create a hazard in the confined cloakroom spaces. Lots of children like to have their own racket but it would really help if you could please permit your children to leave their rackets in school during the week rather than take them home on a daily basis. If they can't we have plenty of rackets here that can be used.
