This is a topic currently at the forefront of educational research and particularly important to the Department of Education as, in today's climate of many teachers leaving the profession, they try to ensure that teacher's time is used purposefully and in the best interests of children.

We have decided to trial a new way of marking which we hope will not only ensure accurate assessment but also engage each child in their own learning and individual development. When you come to parent evenings and look at your children's books, you will see less written teacher comments and hopefully more comments and evidence of understanding where to improve from the children. Please bear with us as we implement what is a significant shift in mind-set and practice for us as I believe that not only will we see benefits for the children but also really important changes to the work life balance of the teachers.

Another highlight of my week has been the various netball training sessions taking place and in particular our first

Wednesday evening session for past pupils as well as current Yr. 6 players. It was great to see girls now in Years 7 and 8 of various Secondary schools coming back to Ickford to play and train together. They laughed, joked, shared school stories and, as if they were still at Ickford, worked hard! Who knows? We may have planted the seed for a new club to emerge.

It's time to go and iron the checked shirt and polish the cowboy boots in preparation for Friday evening's PTA Barn Dance. (If you believe I have such footwear then you don't know me!)
