I can only imagine that the Class 5 outing to Bletchley Park led by the mistress of espionage, Mme Basnett (formerly known as M) triggered a security alert at MI5 and we are now under surveillance.

Bletchley Park is of course famous for being the site of the British Code and Cypher School and eventually home of all the Allied Force code-breakers during World War II and where, amongst hundreds of other men and women, Alan Turing disrupted German intelligence and helped to prevent a successful invasion of the British Isles. Every child I have spoken to about the trip said it was fantastic and they all enjoyed being taken back in time and gaining an insight in to what life was like for those who spent the war years living and working at Bletchley.

The children in Class 5 study WWI and WWII. Today, the same children took part in what can only be described as, an 'outstanding' lesson, during which each one was given a replica Princess Mary Gift Tin. This was a tobacco tin given to the soldiers serving on

the Western Front and its contents included, amongst other things, a postcard from King George V with his Christmas greeting, "May God protect you and bring you safely home" and an Oxo cube (several children had never seen one).

The outing and the effort that went into the lesson today are just a couple of examples of how the teachers enrich the curriculum for the children and manage to engage them in their learning. To go to the trouble of purchasing tins and then filling them with items to fascinate the children is something only a very good teacher would do and I am sure the children will always remember this year.



I managed to show around 18 prospective parents around this week all looking for a school place in September. My advice to each one of them was to look at as many other schools as they can. Ickford is a special place but maybe not everyone's 'cup of tea' and I would rather only those who really appreciate it apply to come here.
