Secondly, you can keep encouraging your children to read every night and engage them in conversation about the books they read and finally, ensure that they make every effort to homework complete any including learning spellings and times tables.

I imagine that these are the customary suggestions that most teachers would give as advice but I would add another. Ensure that your child gets an adequate amount of sleep during the week so that they come to school with the energy to learn. Days at Ickford are full and the children need stamina to be able to concentrate. Sleep is as important as exercise and good nutrition for a healthy childhood and success in the classroom.
